JESUS IS THE DOOR



In John chapter 10, Jesus describes himself as “the door.” For what are doors usually used? Answers may include: safety, protection, to gain access or to keep people out. Why do you think Jesus called himself the door? Read John 10:1-10. Discuss why Jesus used a story about sheep to help explain how he is the door to salvation.
