

FEED FOR ALL SEASONS



Wanting to make an on-site visit and spend time with an existing ministry, I, along with my mother, flew to San Carlos City on February 9, 2018. To reach this new ministry in San Carlos City, we flew from Mati to Cebu then traveled by land and ferry boat to Negros Island.

We arrived in the evening and stayed with my elder brother, Eric. The following day, Eric accompanied me to San Carlos City to witness the feeding program and to actually see firsthand the ministry called *Feed for All Seasons*.

It has been a year since Rhea Romulo, a high school classmate of my sister-in-law, Juliet, started this ministry and desired to be under Agape House Worldwide ministries. While there, I witnessed how she organized the feeding program in remote areas. This ministry feeds

less fortunate kids and elderly people. Before physically feeding them, the Word of God is shared with them.

Ministering to one community for three months, Rhea provides the feeding and Bible studies every Saturday. For those adults who respond to the Word of God and show interest in learning more about Christ, the ministry leaders follow up through Bible studies. After three months, *Feed for All Seasons* moves to another community.

Juliet's sister, Carlita, who is also a Christian, is now partnering with Rhea, and together they are expanding their vision for the ministry. They plan to make it feature much more than a feeding program, such as community organization, livelihood programs, homes for the aged and church plants. After the feeding, I invited Carlita to go with us to Cebu, so we could continue to share from the heart and to

vision cast. We are excited to see how the Lord will continue to expand this ministry.

After returning back home, I continued to keep in touch with Rhea to provide support and Bible study and discipleship materials. Let us continue to pray for Rhea and the Lord's leading for this ministry. Also, let us pray for more workers and provisions as Rhea continues to lead this task.

Let us give God the glory for this exciting, new ministry!
