
GOD GIVES US ALL THINGS



What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?

Romans 8:31-32











We've seen in Romans 8:28 that all things work together for your good as a believer in Christ Jesus. The reason is because we are united to the Father through his Son as an act of grace. "What then shall we say to these things?" (v. 31). Paul asks this question to get us to think and to learn to use 'gospel logic.'

While every good and perfect gift does come to us from our heavenly Father (James 1:17), we are also told by Jesus that in this world we will know trouble (John 16:33). There will be those who oppose and even actively work against us. To see how God trumps this opposition, we must draw inferences from the gospel. God has demonstrated he is for us in giving the good gift of his Son. We are united to God in Christ; therefore no one can overcome us.

In Romans 8:32, God promises to graciously give believers "all things." If God has already sent his Son to save us from our sins, live the life we could not live and suffer the death we deserve, then why would he not give us all things that we truly need? What would he withhold? If I was selling my house for \$200,000 and someone offered me \$199,999 and said he would bring the \$1.00 at closing, I would not reject the offer. I would expect that \$1 at the closing table. Well, God has already given evidence of his infinite love for us, and this means that we can trust

he will give us what we need to grow in his grace. Jesus taught his little flock not to fear for it is God's good pleasure to give his children the kingdom (Luke 12:32). So, encourage your heart this day by using such gospel logic.
