Send a Thoughtful Card

Use one of these questions to guide your thinking to make it personal and meaningful.

- > What is one truth your pastor taught from the pulpit that really stands out to you? How did hearing that truth bring you closer to Jesus?
- > What is one thing that you see in the life of your pastor that you are grateful for?
- > Describe a time when your pastor encouraged you and thank them for it.
- > Describe a time that your pastor handled a challenging situation with a godly attitude and commend them for it.

Send a Gift that Lightens the Financial Load

- > Coffee. Many pastors have on-thefly counseling when crisis strikes. Often the best place to meet is at a restaurant or coffee house. Gift a gift card to a local diner to help out.
- > Books. Gift your pastor an Amazon gift card so that when they see a book that may be beneficial for them or their ministry, they can afford to get it
- > Education. If your pastor is pursuing an advanced degree, make a donation to their cost of classes or books. It will be an investment that pays big dividends for you and your church.
- > Groceries. Pastors often use their homes as a base for hospitality. It can be a joy to have a crowd over, but food costs add up. Help your pastor bless others by giving a gift card to the local grocery.
- > Clothes. Pastors have to dress up, a lot. Suits, ties, dress shirts and dress shoes are expensive and get worn out often. Send a gift card to a local department store where they can replace some worn out items.

Do an Act of Service that Helps Your Pastor

- ➤ Use your skills. Are you an auto mechanic? Landscaper? Nanny? A great cook? Restaurant owner? Handyman? Painter? - > Get involved. Take your church involvement to the next level. Ask your pastor if there are opportunities within the church to exercise your gifts.
- > Share your place. Have a second home or cottage that isn't used all year? Pastors rarely have a vacation budget. Offering a few days at your mountain trailer, lake cottage or beach house could be a tremendous blessing to your pastor.
